A nonprofit partnership between the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation and The IDDeal Foundation proposes to build a small independent residential community for individuals with mild to moderate I/DD.

Question	Facts
What type of proposed housing community is this?	The proposal is low-density residential housing for individuals with only mild-to-moderate intellectual and developmental disabilities. It is NOT a commercial or licensed facility. It is NOT a group home, assisted-living facility, or nursing home. It is NOT a facility for substance abuse or behavioral issues.
Will there be a full-service park open to the greater community?	The proposal includes a passive park area, dog park, and pedestrian walking path with workout stations for local residents to enjoy. There will not be a public parking lot.
Who is developing the proposed community? Are they local or out of state?	The proposed community is being developed by a Florida nonprofit organization, the Pulte Family Charitable Foundation (not Pulte Homes) along with other philanthropic partners.
Will Meadows Blvd be connected to Springfield Blvd?	No. The proposed community will not connect Meadows Blvd with Springfield Blvd.
Will there be a significant increase in traffic in the area?	Fewer than 10% of the residents will drive a car, and therefore will have a minimal impact on traffic.
Will building a community like this have a negative impact on property values?	There have been five similar communities built in Florida. All have enhanced the value of the local community. For an example of a similar community, please visit: NoahsArkFlorida.org



MEET THE IDDEAL FOUNDATION



The IDDeal Foundation is dedicated to addressing pressing issues facing adults with I/DD.

One of the most basic needs for adults with I/DD is housing designed for independent living.



THE NEED FOR INDEPENDENT HOUSING

- In Florida, over 430,000 people are diagnosed with I/DD.
- Florida ranks 49th in the nation for providing services for I/DD populations.
- In the past 34 years, only 6 privately funded I/DD housing communities have been built, providing only 600 out of 430,000 Floridians with I/DD with a home.
- 75% of Floridians with I/DD live with a family caregiver. 31% of their caregivers are over the age of 60. Aging parents and caregivers worry about what will happen when they become deceased, or no longer have the capacity to provide care for their loved one.
